They were too far south for the **Lifewatch Boater Awareness Program** and in those areas boaters are monitored by others such as the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife.


In addition to the Harbour porpoises, Harbour seals and a variety of birds I sighted a Minke whale on May 24th (1820) Heading East and on May 26th (0730) Heading Northwest.

A young Harbour seal was lying on the boat ramp and a guy launching his boat threatened to run over him. I arrived just as another guy poured water over the seal causing him to rush back into the water. I told the guy that it is normal for seals to rest and soak up the sun as humans do. I also advised his son, who wanted to pet the seal, that they can bite and cause serious infections. Let Wildlife Be!
